Message From Our Pastor

By the time you read this message, the Thanksgiving holiday will be over and thoughts turn to the Christmas season. I've been thinking about this a lot lately. In the month of November, we talk a lot about "giving thanks", but in the month of December, as we celebrate Christmas, we "give gifts". I would like to think that we give because we remember the words found in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that [God] gave", but somehow I don't think that's the reason. Some say that, as Christians, we give gifts because we read in scripture that the "wise men" gave gifts to the young Jesus - maybe, but somehow I don't think that even that is the reason why we are in a *gift giving* mood in the month of December. Contrary to popular belief, the majority of the people around the world are **not** Christians and yet many decorate Christmas trees and have presents under the tree. Starting right after the Thanksgiving meal has been eaten, retail owners encourage us to begin shopping for the "perfect" gift for "someone you love". We buy gifts for strangers, by way of "Angel Trees" or our "Manger of Love" and who hasn't put some coins or paper money in one of those Salvation Army buckets that we see everywhere. Yes, November is the time of Thanks giving and December is the time for *giving* money and presents.

Have you ever thought that we, Christians especially, limit ourselves when we put so much effort into the last two months of the year? How about giving thanks to God all year round for all of God's blessings given to us? What about saying "thank you" to family and friends, even to strangers, for some act of kindness that you've been given. Have you ever considered that, whenever and wherever and to whomever you can, that you don't just say thanks with your words but show thanks with your actions? In this season of giving, consider giving to others your time - it won't hurt to take the time out of your busy schedule to visit the sick, clothe the naked, visit those who are in prison or volunteer in the church or some agency to help somebody. Have you thought about giving, year round, the gift of your knowledge and expertise on something? There are so many young people who are in need of a mentor; boys and girls who could benefit from your being involved in a big brother/big sister program, for example. Ever considered combining the two and becoming a foster parent? Finally, it doesn't hurt, but will always help, to give the gift of love all year long. Think about it, what a wonderful way to give thanks to God, through Jesus Christ but by giving your gift of time, knowledge and love to family, friends and strangers alike. After all, to do so would be a wonderful way to acknowledge that Jesus is Lord of your life.

I gift thanks to all of you for being who you are and for serving God through West End UMC in the way that you do. As we make our proverbial way into a new year, I pledge to give to you, West End family, the best that I can give as pastor, as God, through Jesus Christ, gives me grace. West End will eventually have a new church administrator, and I will hold forever the memory of my friend.

For all the reasons we may have for not being a faithful steward, the Bible gives us reasons why we should.

So why should we give? We give financially to God because He has given us everything. When we give to God through the church, we are expressing our love to Him. We should give to expand his Son's church. When we give financially to God, we will become rich in many ways, but especially spiritually. **God gives to us so that we are able to give yet some more.**

Every possession we have is through God. He provides for us so that we can use His resources to bring Him glory and expand His kingdom. God deserves and expects us to give Him first before anything else. He expects us to give cheerfully and regularly and in accordance with our income. Prayerfully consider these principals when determining your gifts to God through the church.
