Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner

Shrove Tuesday gets its name from the ritual of shriving, when the faithful confessed their sins to the local priest and received forgiveness before the Lenten season began. As far back as 1000 AD, "to shrive" meant to hear confessions.

Historically, Shrove Tuesday also marked the beginning of the 40-day Lenten fasting period when the faithful were forbidden to consume meat, butter, eggs or milk. However, if a family had a store of these foods they would certainly spoil by the time the fast ended on Easter Sunday. What to do? Solution: use up the milk, butter and eggs no later than Shrove Tuesday. And so, with the addition of a little flour, the solution quickly presented itself in.....**pancakes**. Today, the Shrove Tuesday pancake tradition lives on in Western Europe, the United States, Canada and Australia.

Please join us for our **Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner** on Tuesday, February 13th. Come between 5:30 - 7:00 pm. Along with pancakes the menu will include sausage and choice of beverage. No reservations are needed but donations will be accepted.

Message From Our Pastor

Have you ever seen a billboard or a poster or some sign/advertisement that caught your eye and caused you to smile, ponder the words and its meaning, etc.? I was having my eyes examined the other day and while I was in the examination rooms awaiting tests, I was struck by two posters, that made me go "hmm" and I had to write the words down. The words to the first poster I saw were "Vision is not seeing things as they are, but as they will be." Think about that statement in terms of faith - there are those to whom God will give a vision for some type of ministry. The ministry or program doesn't exist, yet, but the one who has been given the vision already "sees" it. While we may not see the vision for ourselves, it is important that we encourage, support and help make that vision a reality. God continually plants visions in the hearts and minds of persons, and God continually equips others to carry out the vision. We are all called by God to make things happen that will bring glory to God.

Now, anyone who has been given a vision and anyone who is being equipped to implement the vision will face challenges. The other poster I saw in one of the examining rooms had these words "Challenges can be stepping stones or stumbling blocks. It's just a matter of how you view them." Think about that one - are you one of those "glass half full" or "glass half empty" people? Do you dwell on the negative or do you try to find something positive in whatever situation you find yourself facing? Life is full of ups and downs and twists and turns that challenge your way of thinking, doing and being. Will you use your challenge as a stepping stone to get you from point A to point B or do you run away from the challenge, taking a step backward instead of moving forward? Maybe it's time for some of us to have an attitude adjustment. Don't you know that God is with you and will see you through any challenge or situation that you have to face? As the late rapper Biggy Smalls once rhymed, "if you don't know, now you know".

Finally, when I was coming home from the hospital after visiting Bob Higgins and Joe Williams, I noticed one of the stickers on the car in from of me said, "In God we trust". Now those words are very familiar to us, and yet they took on a new meaning as I was thinking about Bob and Joe as well as some things that have been stressing me out lately. In God we trust: no matter how stressful life can be sometimes, it is God who has the power, authority and will to help us work through any stress and anxiety we might have to face. There are people we encounter daily that prove not to be trustworthy, and yet God is worthy of our trust because God is faithful and gracious and compassionate and merciful and all powerful. We can trust that God will never put us down; will never leave or forsake us; will always protect us; will always love us and that God forgives us even when we can't forgive ourselves. I trust that God's Spirit is with Bob and Joe and that God, through Jesus Christ, will give Viola and Stephen and Sue the love and comfort they need as they sit beside the beds of their loved ones. I trust that God will correct whatever is wrong in your life and mine and that I can count on God to be with me through any situation and in all circumstances.

We are about to enter the season of Lent, a season in which we pause to reflect on what God is doing for us, with us and to us, in Christ Jesus. God's vision for us is that we will have an abundant life; God challenges us to put our faith, hope and trust in the Divine Creator and Sustainer of Life. It is during this season of Lent that we encounter Jesus Christ who gives us a reason to sing one of those old gospel songs: "I will trust in the Lord. I will trust in the Lord until I die." While some of you plan to give up something for Lent, remember that Jesus has not given up on you and in the weeks ahead, we will be reminded that Jesus gave his life for you and for me.
