Meet in the Social Hall and bring your bible. These will be led by Pastor Lynda.




Purchase Your Easter Lily for the Altar





Generosity is a matter of action, intentions, and heart. One way to describe it is the grateful outpouring of gifts to others, out of our love for God. Outpouring is a terrific description since the priceless gift of the gospel comes from God and is meant to be poured out, through our living, upon others. Paul states in II Corinthians 4:5-7, "We have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us."

Generous living is not just about money, or even just about giving. It has to do with the whole of who we are and how we care about our neighbors. (Mark 12: 28-31) The Old Testament word for "heart" is literally the leaning or thrust of our lives. It's what we think about all day long. It's how we feel towards others and especially how we react when we know of a need. Giving is something we do to meet the budget. Now the budget has all kinds of "missional" items but giving is also what we do after we give to the offering. When people are good at "generous living," the budget will always be satisfied and the needs around us will also be taken care of.

A little girl was having dinner with her family one night and the father had the blessing. He went through the normal ritual but at the end he said, "And please help our neighbor who lives alone and has a screen door that has fallen off, a gutter that is clogged and a mailbox that got hit by a car." Then he ended with an Amen. His little girl then looked up at her father and said, "Can I have your wallet?" The father responded – "why would you want my wallet?" The answer was simple – "To help our neighbor!"

It's all about generous living! We don't always need money to help someone. We sometimes need to take our hammer and saw and give our neighbor a hand. Sometimes "generous living" is about giving money and sometimes it's a way of life that helps those we know about.

Generous Living is about every aspect of our life together before God. Won't you be a "good steward" today?

II Corinthians 4:5-7: For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us.
