

Giving Means Thinking Positively

"Make the most of every chance you get. These are desperate times." (Ephesians 5:16 - *The Message*)

Tax time is upon us. Aside from the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, it can be one of the most stressful times of the year for many people. For many it means paying at least a bit more to pay that bill in full. Still others are excited to finish the task because they've been planning and looking forward to the "gift" they're receiving with their refund.

The number one reason for marital breakdown is financial conflict. Therefore, tax time is also the time to take extra care in your relationships as you review receipts, checkbooks, and 1040 forms. Even if you are lucky enough to keep your job in these tough times, chances are you're worried about the economy and how it may affect you and those you love. What about our church?
