Crossroads' Food Pantry is a Blessing to the Community



The Manger of Love will be Collecting for Health Kits at this Time

The Manger of Love will be open at this time for the collection of items for the **VA Conference Health Kits**. Items to be collected are:

- **Hand towels** (15" X 25" up to 17" X 27") – not a kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- **Wash clothes** – not a kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- **Combs** – sturdy 4"-7" – not a pocket comb or a comb with a handle
- **Toenail or fingernail clippers** – no emery boards or metal nail files
- **Bath-size soap** (3 oz. bar or larger) – no Ivory or Jergen's soap – do not remove from packaging
- **Adult toothbrushes** – personal advertising not acceptable – do not remove from packaging
- **Adhesive bandages** (3/4 X 3 inches) – common household bandages acceptable
- **One-gallon size resealable bags**

Other important pieces of information are as follows: All items must be new. Do not wash any of the items as they will no longer be considered new. Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

The United Women in Faith will see that these items are appropriately packaged and delivered to the Annual VA Conference in June.

10 Tips for a More Meaningful Lent

Lent is a time for self-reflection and deepening one's relationship with God in Jesus Christ. For many this season leading up to Easter will be weeks of giving up something they enjoy as a sign of contrition for mistakes they have made. Others will spend extra time in devotions and prayer, while a few more will carry a cross or nail in their pocket as a reminder of the sacrifice Jesus made for them and the whole world.

If those practices work for you, wonderful! Others may want to find different ways of observing this holy season. Consider adopting one or more of the following creative uses of the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.

1. **Apologize to someone.** Lent is a great time to seek forgiveness from those we have harmed.
2. **Perform random acts of kindness.** Share the love of Jesus in any way you can think of each day during Lent.
3. **Delve into a book of the Bible.** In the six weeks of Lent, you could develop a deep understanding of a book of the Bible about which you have always been curious.
4. **Serve people in need.** Volunteer to serve an organization throughout the season of Lent.
5. **Visit the lonely.**
6. **Read Wesley's sermons about the Sermon on the Mount (available online).** Reading these sermons will give you a sense of what it means to be a United Methodist in the tradition of John Wesley.
7. **Tell others you love them.**
8. **Throw a party for everyone.** Host your own Kingdom party by cooking for the neighborhood or buying lunch for the entire office or your church. Feed everyone you can and give people an opportunity to be together.
9. **Serve in worship.** Our church needs you. Sing in the choir, usher, serve as liturgist, assist with our PowerPoint, volunteer for the nursery. Don't wait for someone to ask you to use your God-given gifts.
10. **Say "thank you".** Send a note of gratitude each week during lent to one of the people who have shaped you into the person you are. Tell them how much they meant to you and how they inspired you. You may even consider a small gift.
